



Port St Mary Station, The Chasms, Cregneash to Port Erin Station.

Go through the lovely fishing village of Port St Mary to The Chasms and Cregneash with outstanding views, dramatic geology and a remarkable living museum.

RAILWAY WALKS

2 MODERATE

Distance:	4.95 miles
Start:	Port St Mary Station (<i>Outdoor Leisure Map Ref: 281 699</i>)
Finish:	Port Erin Station (<i>Outdoor Leisure Map Ref: 266 671</i>)
By Steam Railway:	Take the steam train starting from Douglas or Port Erin, alight at Port St Mary Station.
By Bus:	Services 1, 2, 10, 10A, 11, 11A, 12, 12A connect Douglas or Port Erin with Port St Mary.

Facilities (subject to opening hours)

Port St Mary:	Public Toilets, public houses, restaurants, cafés and general stores
Cregneash:	Café
Port Erin:	Public Toilets, public houses, restaurants, cafés and general stores

Route

1. Turn right out of Port St Mary Station, straight across the crossroads and through Port St Mary village to the harbour.
2. Continue on this road with the sea on your left joining a grassy track along the edge of a golf-course as the houses finish. You are now on the *Raad ny Foillan* (coastal footpath).
3. Continue along the path as it heads through a small estate.
4. Turn left as you join a lane. It ascends steeply and after a few houses it becomes a grassy track.
5. Continue along the well-walked track, heading towards what looks like a derelict house, but is the old Chasms cafe and is now a shelter. The Chasms are opposite the shelter, through a gated fence.
6. Take the steep footpath adjacent to the shelter which leads to Cregneash. You have now left the coastal path.
7. Walk through the village and turn left on the A31.
8. Almost opposite is a lane on the right, take this and then the track on the right.
9. Follow the track over Mull Hill visiting the 2nd World War radar station and Meayll Circle.
10. Take the path down to the lane, which now starts to descent steeply to Port Erin.
11. Turn right into St George's Crescent past Breagle Glen and return to Port Erin Station.



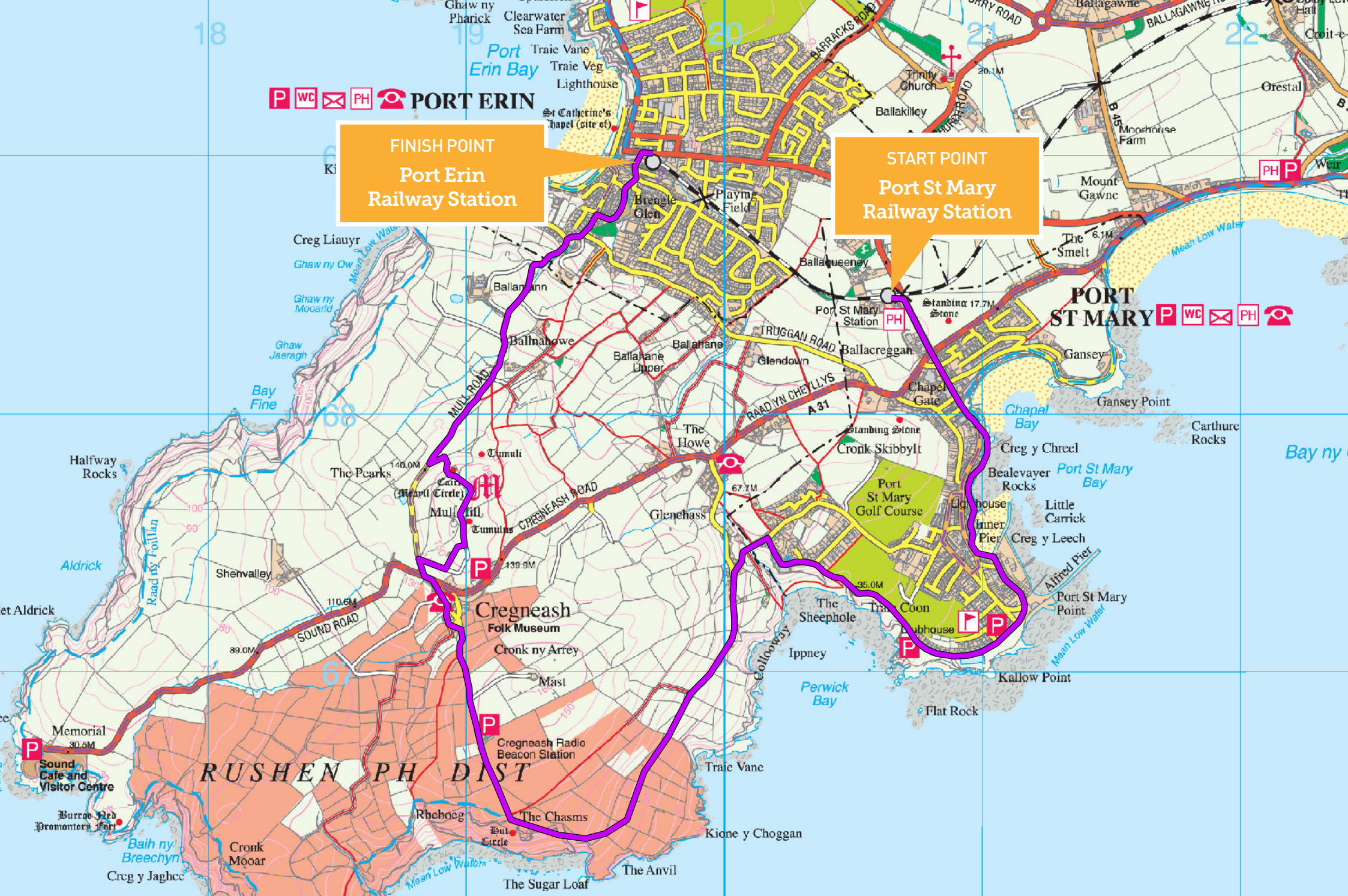
Points of Interest

Cregneash: A working folk museum depicting traditional Manx life.

Mull Hill: The site of a 2nd World War radar station.

Meayll Circle: A prehistoric burial ground.
