ROUTE

- The three footpath routes have been marked out at the Ayres. They all begin at the Visitor Centre follow the coloured stobs in the ground which correspond to the walk you want to do.
- Red route: surfaced, wooden steps, grass.
- Blue Route: mixed terrain of grass and sand.
- Black Route: mixed terrain of grass, sand and shingle.
