| Start & Finish: | Santon Station (<i>Outdoor Leisure Map Ref: 311 722</i>) |
| By Steam Railway: | Take the steam train starting from Douglas or Port Erin, alight at Santon Station. |
| By Bus: | Services 1, 1A, 2, 10, 10A, 11, 11A, 12, 12A, Connect Douglas or Port Erin with Santon. (tell the driver you wish to stop at Santon) |

Facilities (subject to opening hours)

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| Douglas: | Public toilets, public houses, restaurants, cafés, general stores |
| Ballasalla: | Public toilets, public houses, restaurant, general stores |

Route

1. Turn left out of Santon Station and walk parallel to the railway track for a few yards until you reach the B26.
2. Turn right along this quiet lane for approximately 600 yards.
3. Turn left onto the A25 and then almost immediately turn right, signposted Port Grenaugh. This lane takes you through Glen Grenaugh to the tiny bay of Port Grenaugh.
4. When you arrive at the bay take the kissing gate on the left. This footpath meanders through a beautiful glen and alongside Arragon House.
5. Turn right at Arragon House and continue along the tarmac track, turning left at Meary Vooar then, left again at Meary Veg onto the concrete track.
6. At the crossroads turn right up hill onto the *Raad ny Foillan* (coastal footpath).
7. At Balnahow Farm turn right and continue along the *Raad ny Foillan* heading towards Santon Head and back to Port Grenaugh along the cliffs.
8. When you arrive at Port Grenaugh, take the lane back to Santon Station.



Points of Interest

Port Grenaugh: *Cronk ny Merriu:*

The remains of a promontory fort dating back to the Celtic Iron age.
