

Laxey Glen Gardens, Laxey Village

Baldrine, Axnfell, Glen Roy,

A varied walk incorporating quiet lane walking through the serene Manx countryside ending in the village of Laxey, home of the Great Laxey Wheel. This walk is steep in places and can be muddy in the glen.

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Distance:	3.2 miles	4	MODERATE	C
Start:	Baldrine Halt (Outdoor Leisure Map Ref: 429 812)			
Finish:	Laxey Station (Outdoor Leisure Map Ref: 431 858)			
By Manx Electric Railway:	Take the tram starting from Douglas or Ramsey, alight at Ba	aldrii	ne Halt	
By Bus:	Services 3 and 3A connect Douglas with Laxey and Ramsey			

Facilities (subject to opening hours)

Laxey:

Public toilets, several cafés and public houses, village shops

Route -

- 1. Leaving Baldrine Halt, cross the railway line and walk up the very quiet lane for 1 mile to Conrhenny Plantation.
- 2. Follow the lane round to the right in front of the plantation as it joins the B20.
- **3.** When you meet another minor road, the B12, turn right and continue along here for 0.5 miles.
- **4.** As the road bears sharply to the right, take the footpath through Axnfell Plantation.

- **5.** Continue on the clearly defined and signposted footpath as it zig-zags through the plantation down to Glen Roy.
- 6. Turn right and follow the river to Laxey Glen Gardens.
- 7. Leave the gardens, keeping Laxey Flour Mill on your right.
- 8. Turn left to Laxey village where the Manx Electric Railway (MER) station can be found across the main road. The Great Laxey Mines Railway and Snaefell Wheel are just beyond, and here you will spot the Great Laxey Wheel a little further up the Valley.
