This fire risk assessment is written to comply with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005; the purpose being to identify the key measures needed to safeguard the safety of employees, guests and other persons who may be affected in case of fire. The fire risk assessment should be undertaken by the owner or employer in most cases, or someone appointed by such person/s to carry out the task who is considered 'competent'. A person is considered 'competent' "where he has sufficient training and experience or knowledge and other qualities to enable him properly to implement the measures".

The fire risk assessment should be reviewed if there is a reason to suspect it is no longer valid.
