Road Closures

The A18 Mountain Road is ONE WAY to traffic from Ramsey hairpin to the Creg-ny-Baa from 4:30pm on Friday 24th May to 9:30am on Tuesday 11th June. Cycling is prohibited on the aforementioned section of road during the period specified.

Please note: the A18 Mountain Road between Barrule Park, Ramsey and the Creg-ny-Baa will remain closed from the end of a race until a time no later than one hour after the latest time referred to in the table above (TT course closure) for the relevant date.

*Where indicated, the whole TT Course will be open to traffic between 5:00pm and 6:00pm except for the Mountain Road section between Barrule Park, Ramsey, and Cronk-ny-Mona, Onchan.

TT Grandstand Parking

When visiting the TT you may want to spend your day at the Grandstand and surrounding areas, where you'll be able to explore the buzzing atmosphere of the paddock, soak up the entertainment and eateries available in the Fan Park, or grab a front row ticket to the startline and pit lane action with Grandstand seats.

The good news is, if you are wanting to spend your days in the heart of the action, there are plenty of ways to travel to the TT Grandstand and Paddock.

Travelling by Car - St George's Car Park

If you're travelling by car there is free public parking available in St George's, off Dukes Avenue. There will be a temporary traffic management system in place, so if you are planning to use this car park you should follow the access route along Victoria Road, turning up Victoria Avenue before continuing left onto Upper Dukes Street and then turning right into Dukes Avenue.

If you are planning to use St George's Car Park, you should be aware that there will be no access to Dukes Avenue via Glencrutchery Road, as this section of the road will be closed throughout the duration of the TT with access retained for Police Vehicles only.

Stewards will be on hand to manage the flow of traffic and guide you to the TT Grandstand and Paddock. A map showing details of how to access the St George's Car Park site can be found [here](#).

Motorcycle Parking & Permit Holders - Noble's Park Car Park

If you are travelling to the TT Grandstand and Paddock by motorcycle, you should use Noble's Park Car Park.

Noble's Park Car Park is also accessible by car if you are a permit holder. This includes Blue Badge holders, Mercury Club Hospitality ticket holders, and TT parking pass holders. If you have a qualifying permit you will be able to access Noble's Park Car Park via St Ninian's Road where there will be a parking lane in place, with stewards on-hand to manage the traffic flow.

If you are using Noble's Park Car Park, you should be aware that during TT, traffic will be one-way down St Ninian's Road and will also be one-way on Marathon Drive to ensure a continuous flow of traffic.

In addition to the Blue Badge holder parking in Noble's Park Car Park, there are also additional spaces for Blue Badge holders in St George's Car Park.

Parking at the TT Grandstand and Paddock complex is always limited and you are encouraged to plan your journey and to use the public transport routes available where possible to minimise delays.



Travelling by Bus & Rail



During the TT period, from Friday 24th May to Saturday 8th June, the Island's bus services are subject to amendments or cancellations depending on racing and road closures. It is recommended that all journeys are planned accordingly in advance - please check the TT diversion notices at www.bus.im

HELP US PROTECT THE ISLAND'S ENVIRONMENT

To protect the environment, kindly stay on designated green lanes and greenway roads exclusively. Avoid travelling over any open hill land. This season is crucial for wildlife, particularly protected ground-nesting birds like Hen Harrier and Curlew. Disturbing these birds is illegal. Additionally, livestock are with young during this period, so please be mindful not to cause them distress.

RESPECT OUR UPLAND LANDSCAPE

Be mindful of the heathland and tracts of peat lying adjacent to many of the green lanes and greenways which can become damaged and eroded when people travel wide of the proper track. Use legal routes to access the TT course, and please shut gates behind you, including at points of entry and exit.

EXPLORE WITH THE OUTDOOR LEISURE MAP

Scan the QR code to access the Island's Outdoor Leisure Map, detailing green lanes and greenway roads in the vicinity of the TT course. Maps are also available from the Welcome Centre located at the Sea Terminal, contactable at +44 1624 686801.





FIRE SAFETY

BE WILDFIRE AWARE



Barbecues, campfires and camp stoves can very easily spread out of control, and drier, warmer weather increases the risk of wildfires.

We want to continue protecting the Island's communities and environment, sensitive habitats and the wildlife that call it home.



Check first with the landowner if barbecues, campfires & camp stoves are permitted.



Only use barbecues in a suitable and safe area, such as on a raised, flat surface away from long vegetation. Never leave them unattended.



Ensure that your barbecue, campfire or camp stove is fully extinguished and cold before disposing of the contents.



Extinguish & dispose of cigarettes/ E-cigarettes properly.



Keep a bucket of water or sand nearby for emergencies.



Do not leave any litter including bottles or glass. Sunlight shining through glass can start large fires. Take litter home or put them in a waste/recycling bin.



Never light an open fire in the countryside. Bring a picnic with you as an alternative.



Embers from barbecues, campfires and campfires can easily be carried by the wind and light surrounding vegetation.

Follow all signage prohibiting the use of barbecues, campfires and camp stoves across the Island's countryside.



If you see a fire in the countryside, report it immediately by calling 999 and ask for the fire service. Don't put yourself in any immediate danger by attempting to tackle fast-spreading fires. Leave the area as soon as possible.
