BY BUS

BY RAIL

For TT 2023 Isle of Man Transport is operating four Heritage Railways which offer a unique way to discover the island and also to watch the races.

The Isle of Man Steam Railway operates in the south of the Island, between Port Erin and Douglas. Why not try the dining train? We have our Bikers Special Pie and Mash and TT Commuter Club trains.

The Manx Electric Railway heads north between Douglas and Ramsey, via Laxey where you can connect with the Snaefell Mountain Railway. This fantastic feat of engineering combines Victorian charm with spectacular views.

A Snaefell Mountain Railway runs from Laxey up to Snaefell Summit. From Laxey travel half way up the mountain to the Bungalow, a fantastic spot to see the races. While you're there why not take the opportunity to go right to the top and enjoy the Summit cafe with panoramic views of the Island.

Douglas Bay Horse Trams have been in existence on the Isle of Man since 1876. Start your journey at Derby Castle, Douglas or the Villa Marina. Then simply sit back, relax and enjoy the journey along Douglas Promenade.

PEAK TIMES

TT1

On race days this service will operate from the South of the Island and travel to the Grandstand before continuing as a TT6, departing Port St Mary Harbour at 07:30am calling at Port Erin station, Shore Hotel, Castletown Bypass/School Hill and Ballasalla. You may continue on this service around the course as a TT6.

TT6

On race days this service will take you to your favourite place to watch the action. Departing Lord Street Douglas via the Grandstand, the TT6 serves Quarterbridge, Glen Vine, Crosby, Ballacraine, Laurel Bank, Cronk-y-Voddy, Kirk Michael, Ballaugh, Sulby and Ramsey. Some of the best spots around the course!

TT3

On race days this service takes you from Lord Street Douglas via the Grandstand to the Creq-ny-Baa grandstands and viewing areas. An amazing spot to watch the races! After the races we will come and collect you.

HULLAD OIE NIGHT OWL PREMIUM SERVICES



From Wednesday 31st May to Saturday 10th June the Hullad Oie Night Owl services operate. These are our late night buses which operate between Douglas, the North, West and South and depart at 00:15 or 01:15 (please note the 31st May and 1st June will be 00:15 only). A one-way system is in operation over the Mountain Road, from Ramsey Hairpin to the Creg Ny Baa, for the whole of the TT festival.

Temporary speed limits will be introduced in various locations around the Island to cope with the increased volume of traffic, to improve safety for all road users. Driving bans imposed by an Isle of Man Court also apply in the UK as there is a reciprocal ban agreement in place.


Marked and unmarked police bikes operating

CAMPSITE CRIME



- . Don't leave valuables inside your tent (including car keys).
- · Keep bank cards, cash and small valuables on your person where possible.
- . If you have a vehicle, keep larger valuables locked inside and out of sight.
- · Secure property you leave outside your tent.
- · Padlocks can draw attention to you tent.
- · Mark your valuables with a UV pen.
- · Split up your cash and cards.
- · Report any suspicious behaviour.
- · Get to know your surroundings.
- . KNOW YOUR LIMITS alcohol can impair judgement.

BBQ SAFETY



- · Never light a BBQ inside a tent.
- · Only use a BBQ on a flat and even surface on either bricks or paving slabs.
- Places BBqs well away from well away from the house, shed or fences, trees, shrubs and other structures.
- . Do not use disposable barbecues near or on public benches.
- · Keep children and pets away from cooking areas.
- · Never leave your BBQ unattended.
- Always have a bucket of sand or water available in the the event of a fire emergency.
- If you're using a disposable BBQ ensure it has cooled before putting it in the bin. To avoid starting a fire you should allow it to cool for several hours and then consider pouring water over it to make sure it's out.
- · Don't drop cigarettes or anything burning onto dry ground.

SPECTATOR SAFETY AND

BEHAVIOUR GUIDELINES





Remember, where these signs are displayed it is prohibited to spectate in the area. This is for your own safety and the safety of the riders.


Choose your position carefully and consider your safety. The spot that gives you a great view may not be the safest place to spectate. A motorcycle travelling at 100mph is covering over 44 metres every second and on the faster sections of the course they can reach speeds in the region of 200mph.

Always ask yourself - "if something did go wrong, would I have time to react and move out of the way?". If the answer is no, then you need to move to a safer position. Remember: listen to the Police and Marshals. Keep your belongings secure and away from the track.



Fragen Sie sich ob Sie im Falle eines Unglücks Zeit zu reagieren und zu fliehen hätten. Lautet die Antwort nein, befinden Sie sich wahrscheinlich an einer unsicheren Stelle. Denken Sie daran: Hören Sie auf die Anweisungen der Polizei und der Streckenposten. Bewahren Sie Ihre Sachen sicher und abseits der Strecke auf.

Une moto circulant à 100 mph soit 44 mètres pas seconde peut atteindre une vitesse de 200 mph sur les tronçons les plus rapides de la course. Si malheureusement quelque chose a mal tourné, demandez-vous - "Aurais eu-je le temps de réagir et de bougar?" Si la réponse est non, vous vous trouvez probablement à une place dangereuse. N'oubliez pas : écouter les consignes de la police et des commissaires de course. Gardez vos affaires en sécurité et loin de la piste de course.



Elija su posición cuidadosamente y tenga presente su seguridad. Es posible que la posición con mejores vistas no sea la más segura. Las motos a 100 mi/h recorren más de 44 metros por segundo y en los tramos más rápidos llegan a alcanzar velocidades del orden de 200 mi/h. Si, por un infortunio, algo saliese mal, hágase la siguiente pregunta: "¿Hubiera tenido tiempo de reaccionar y moverme?" Si su respuesta es negativa, entonces es probable que el sitio elegido no cuente con grantías de seguridad. Recuerde: Siga las instrucciones de la policía y asistentes del evento, y mantenga sus pertenencias vigiladas y lejos del recorrido.



Once the roads have closed do not go onto them. Walking or encroaching onto a closed road could result in you being prosecuted and facing a heavy fine up to £2,500.

Parking

Policy disc parking zones are in operation in main towns. Where signposted, display a car parking disc showing the time of arrival or you may be subject to a fine. There is no policy for motorcycle parking. Discs are available from vehicle hire firms, the Sea Terminal, Police Stations, Post Offices and local Commissioners' Offices.

MONEY & MOBILE

Currency

The Isle of Man has its own currency with the same denominations as UK sterling, UK currency is legal tender in the Isle of Man but Manx currency is not accepted in the UK, although notes can be exchanged at UK banks.

Banks & Cash Machines

Most high street banks have premises on the Isle of Man and predominantly in Douglas. ATMs available in all major towns around the Isle of Man. Manx bank notes are dispensed from all cash machines apart from those situated at the Sea Terminal and the Airport, where English notes are issued.

Mobile Phones

The Island's mobile network providers are Manx Telecom and Sure who share commercial agreements with networks in the UK, Europe and the rest of the world. It is advisable to check with your mobile network to determine the level and charges of the roaming services.
