1. **Show consideration for others**
 Be courteous to all other users and take care when passing horses, cyclists, walkers and livestock.
 Be prepared to stop if needed.
 Travel at a quiet and unobtrusive pace and only in small groups.

2. **Stick to the defined track**
 Stay on the defined and legal route observing any markers and signs. Any deviation from the legal route is an offence under Section 28 of the Road Traffic Act 1985.
 Do not widen the track in any way and only deviate from its course when absolutely necessary.

3. **Ensure you and your vehicle are fully road-legal**
 Remember that you are subject to the same laws as surfaced roads. Adhere to all traffic and advisory signs.
 Check for advanced notice of track closures including those which are enforced annually during the winter months.

4. **Assess your own impact**
 Abstain from using the more vulnerable, unsurfaced tracks during or after periods of heavy rain. Ride or drive gently to avoid unnecessary damage where the ground is soft.

5. **Consider your impact on the environment and wildlife**
 Please remember that many Green Lanes traverse farmland and grazed uplands. Pregnant, nursing sheep and their lambs are particularly vulnerable to disturbance between early spring and mid-summer. Ensure all gates are left closed unless they have been intentionally left open. Be courteous and the considered use of the countryside is a key to our wildlife and damage sensitive habitats. Please take your litter home with you.
