

Travelling to the Isle of Man

- the process and key things to know

If you have been in the Common Travel Area (CTA), or a country on [England's Green or Amber list](#) for 10 days prior to travel and are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, meaning you have had the full course of a recognised vaccine (Pfizer BioNTech; Oxford/AstraZeneca; Moderna, Johnson and Johnson/Janssen or the clinically trialled Valneva, Novovax, Com-COV or Com-COV 2) and two weeks have passed since the final dose, the Island is delighted to welcome you back.

1. Prior to booking any transport or accommodation

- You must complete a [Vaccination Exemption Form](#) at least 36 hours before your arrival to the Island.
- Here you are required to upload proof that you have received a full course of any COVID-19 vaccine recognised by the UK's Medicines & Healthcare Products Regulatory Agency (MHRA) or any other competent body and 14 days have elapsed since receiving the final dose.
- Once your application has been verified, you will be sent an email confirming if it has been approved or declined. If approved, the email will also include a Vaccination Exemption Reference Number to use when completing your [Landing Form](#).

Note: Once you have received your Vaccination Exemption Reference Number, this can be used for all future trips, allowing you to visit the Isle of Man limitless times with no testing or self-isolation upon arrival.

2. Before departing to the Isle of Man

- No earlier than 48 hours before you are due to arrive in the Isle of Man, you must complete a [Landing Form](#). One Landing Form per visitor must be completed, including one for each child under the age of 18.
- Here, you will be required to input your Vaccination Exemption Reference Number from Step 1.
- Once completed, you will be sent an email confirming that you are exempt from self-isolation and testing upon arrival, but that you must not enter a healthcare setting for 10 days from your date of arrival.
- On the same email will be a QR code/barcode. This QR code/barcode is important and will be scanned upon entry to the Isle of Man to show that all pre-requisites have been met.

Note: In order to be exempt from self-isolation and testing upon arrival, you must insert your Vaccination Exemption Reference Number from Step 1 when completing your Landing Form.

3. Upon arrival in the Isle of Man

- You will be required to present the QR code/barcode (you may show a printed copy or a copy on a device) along with photographic ID (please see page 8 of the [Visitor Guidance](#) for a full list of accepted IDs).
- Please also ensure you have your evidence of your vaccination status in case this is required. We will not need to see the evidence if you have completed all of the above steps correctly prior to arriving.

Note: We encourage you to bring your own lateral flow testing kits with you to the Island and continue to test during your visit.

Requirements for children travelling to the Isle of Man

Ages 12-17: Children aged 12 – 17 who have not had a full course of a COVID-19 vaccine will be required to follow the 'Test to Release' pathway (if travelling from the CTA or a country on England's Green list), or the '7 Day Isolation' pathway (if travelling from a country on England's Amber list). For both pathways each child must have a COVID-19 PCR test within 48 hours of arrival, and isolate until they receive a negative result (Test to Release) or for 7 days (7 Day Isolation). Adults who are fully vaccinated do not need to isolate with the children, however may choose to do so. Tests can be booked by calling +44 (0) 1624 822111 (between 8am-8pm, 7 days a week) or online. Landing forms must have been completed before booking a COVID-19 Test.

Ages 0-11: Children aged 0-11 are exempt from testing and quarantine.
