

#### **WELCOME TO THE MANANAN FESTIVAL 2018 PREVIEW**

The Mananan International Festival of Music and the Arts has been active for forty-four years at the Erin Arts Centre, Victoria Square, Off Upper Promenade, Port Erin, Isle of Man.

The Erin Arts Centre, founded in 1971, has fulfilled a unique and important role as a venue for music and theatre in the Isle of Man. Under the guiding hand of the founder and Director, Dr John Bethell MBE, D.Mus (Hon), Hon RNCM, the Centre has received international recognition as home to a number of prestigious events including the annual Mananan International Summer and Opera Festivals, founded in 1975, the Lionel Tertis International Viola Festival & Competition, founded in 1980, and the Barbirolli International Oboe Festival & Competition, founded in 2005.

Staffed almost entirely by a dedicated team of voluntary helpers, the Erin Arts Centre has become a prestigious venue for international artists of the highest calibre. The fine acoustic of the **Isle of Man Bank Auditorium** is suitable for nearly all forms of art. Its versatility in terms of space enables it to accommodate anything from drama and instrumental recitals to small orchestral ensembles, choral concerts, opera and, more recently, films and live screenings of opera from The New York Metropolitan and Glyndebourne, opera and ballet from Paris Opera and plays from London's Globe Theatre without losing its special atmosphere of intimacy.

The Centre has its own gallery space. The **Sir James Mellon Gallery** opened in 1994, and its fine combination of natural and artificial light makes it ideal for arts & crafts projects and exhibitions. These features also lend themselves to education and corporate presentations and lectures.




### Welcome to this year's Festival:

"Sir Thomas Allen - one of the most distinguished and charismatic baritones the United Kingdom has ever produced - reflects on his rich, varied, and still active career with reference to his signature roles and many recordings. He features regularly on BBC Radio 3 and 4 and presented the 2007 series of the musical quiz *Counterpoint*. On television, he has commentated a number of times at the Cardiff Singer of the World competition.






