Path to main entrance

- From the street to the main entrance, there are 4 steps. There is no ramp and no lift.

Main entrance

- The main entrance has 4 steps.
- The main door is side hung and manual.

Bedrooms

- All bedrooms have windows.
- Bedrooms have ceiling lights, bedside lamps and natural daylight.
- Lights are traditional filament. TVs have subtitles.
- All bedrooms are non-smoking.
- We have non-allergic bedding.
- All bedrooms have fitted carpets.
- No bedrooms have level access. The bedroom nearest the main entrance has 13 steps.
- All bedrooms are ensuite.
- We have bathrooms with a separate shower.
- We have bathrooms with a bath and overhead shower.
