The festival programme has been put together to include walks to suit people of all abilities. We have graded each walk as follows:
Easy gentle slopes (1-4 miles
Moderate gentle slopes (1-6 miles)
Hard some difficult terrain and hilly sections (1-9 miles)
Very Hard longer walks with varied terrain (10+ miles)

#### In the path of the Vikings (Battle of Skyhill - Walk and Canoe Journey)



Meeting at Conrods Pizzeria (Boathouse Café) at the Mooragh Park, we will start with a minibus journey to the beginning of our walk (provided in price of walk). The exact location of the start of the walk will be weather dependent but will include a journey on foot through Skyhill plantation and the surrounding areas before reaching our first destination. the site of the battle of Skyhill. Famously this is where Godred Crovan successfully battled with Manx forces in 1079 taking the Island from the ruling King, after he and his forces ascended the Sulby river in boats.

Once we have explored the area we will walk to the Sulby river to join our canoes and retrace the journey of Godred Crovan and his forces back down the Sulby river to Ramsey. We will journey in stable rafted canoes along this flat and scenic part of the Sulby river.

This is a maximum 8km walk, followed by approximately 1hr canoe journey.

The abseil itself will take us down a spectacular 110ft sea cliff to a secluded beach. Once we have all completed the abseil we will carry on our journey to Port
